

Seminole Strip of the Month

Strip # 2 - Make a 42 inch wide strip as follows

Fabric requirements - all strips are width of fabric:

Fabric B: Two strips, 3 inches wide

Fabric C: One strip, 3 inches wide

Fabric D: Two strips, 3.5 inches wide

Tips:

- As with Strip 1, flipping every second strip makes seams nest nicely, and pinning really helps.
- Think about seam allowances when trimming the peaks in the final step

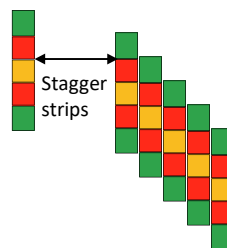
Stitch together into base strip blocks as shown.
Press all seams in the same direction.



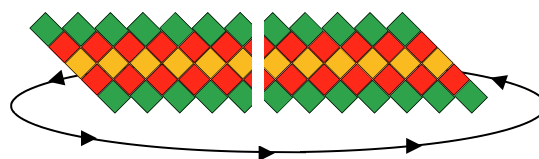
Cut into 3 inch slices.
You will need twelve or thirteen to make a 42" final strip, depending on your seam allowance.



Sew back together, flipping every second slice, and staggering the strips so they form a staircase shape.



Cut vertically through the new strip, and join the two slanting ends to create your final strip



Trim the top and bottom peaks, making sure to leave enough seam allowance so you don't cut off the top of the inner diamonds when you sew the finished strips into a quilt.
