

**Strip # 7 - Make a 42 inch wide strip as follows**

**Fabric requirements-** all strips are width of fabric:

Fabric A: Three strips 1.5 inches wide,  
plus one strip 3 inches wide

Fabric B: Two strips 1.75 inches wide (set this aside until final construction)

Fabric C: Three strips 1.5 inches wide,  
plus one strip 3 inches wide

**Reminder:**

.25 = 1/4  
.5 = 1/2  
.75 = 3/4

Piece together the strips of fabrics A and C into strip sets as shown. **Note** that you need to make two of strip set 3.

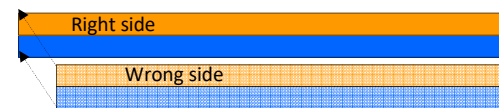


Fold strip sets 1 and two in half, so that you will be cutting through a double layer of fabric. This will create mirror image shapes for construction of your arrow heads.

Cut at a 45 degree angle into 2.5 inch slices.

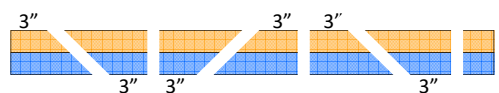


Using the two pieces of strip set 3, stack one on top of the other, right sides together, and matching fabrics C to C, and A to A.



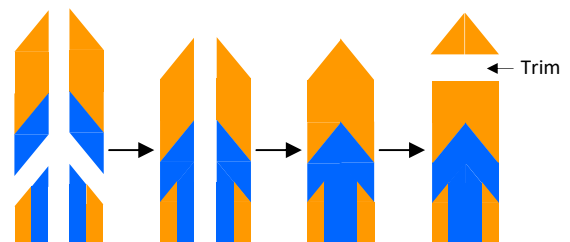
Square up one end, measure 3 inches and cut through both layers at a 45 degree angle as shown. Measure 3 inches from the end of this cut, and make a 90 degree cut.

This creates mirrored shapes for construction of your arrow shafts.

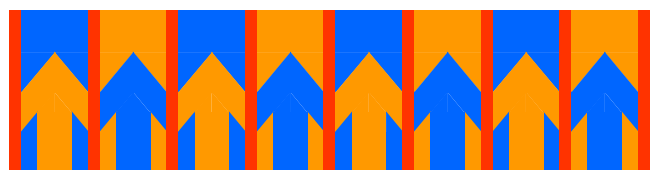


Construct your arrow blocks as shown, trimming into a rectangle.

You need to construct four of each colour (plus the sashing) to make a 42 inch finished strip.



Using the reserved strips of fabric B as sashing, connect your arrows, alternating colourways. You can also alternate arrow direction if you like.
